

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












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2021 - The Year of the Professional Contractor






BREAKDOWN OF THE CONTRACTING MARKET BY SECTOR






ALL PROFESSIONAL SERVICE SECTORS SHOWING GROWTH





+Stay And Spend Scheme

Stay and Spend Scheme

It's not often the tax man wants to buy you a meal... but in an attempt to boost the Irish tourism sector, the Government have introduced the new "Stay and Spend" tax credit.

How does it work?

Running from 1 October 2020 until 30 April 2021, a 20% tax credit will be available to you on the cost of certain accommodation, food and drink.

The allowable expenditure includes the cost of staying in hotels, guest houses, hostels, campsites and some self-catering properties. It also includes the cost of any "sit- in" meals and any non-alcoholic drinks.

So, if you spend €500 on a night in a hotel, including an evening meal and some drinks, you can submit the receipts to Revenue and

claim back up to €100, reducing your €500 spend to €400.

Better yet, a nice meal out in your local restaurant for 2 people at a cost of €100 can result in a tax rebate of €20.

Maximum claim

The maximum expense you can claim is $\[\[\] \]$ 625 per person over the course of the 7 months, meaning the most you can claim back from Revenue when filing your tax return is $\[\]$ 125. For couples who are jointly assessed, the maximum expense is doubled to $\[\]$ 1,250 giving a total refund of $\[\]$ 250.

Restrictions

- No credit is allowed for alcoholic drinks, or for spends of less than €25 per person.
- Businesses must register for Revenue's "Stay & Spend" tax credit in order to allow customers claim their tax credit.
- Registered service providers should also ensure that the receipts they issue to you include all relevant details, including the name of their business and an itemised breakdown of services provided.

How to claim your credit

As an employee, you can claim your credit via your "MyAccount" on Revenue.ie or through Revenue's Receipts Tracker App.

If you're contracting with us, just hold on to your receipts and come tax return time, we'll make sure that your tax liability is reduced by the credit you are due.



Top tips

- Always look for the "Stay and Spend" logo when deciding where to stay or eat.
- Ensure you receive a valid receipt from the business.
- Employees can download Revenue's new "Receipt Tracker App". If you spend more than €25 per person on food, non-alcoholic drink or on allowable accommodation in a registered business, upload your receipt to the app straight away. You can then bin the paper receipt and avoid the hassle of minding your receipts until tax return time.

It may not be a free meal, but it might just cover the cost of your starter...

Completing your 2019 Irish Tax Return

As a professional contractor, you are obliged to file a personal Irish tax return (Form 11) to the Irish Revenue by 31 October 2020. As always, if you are a Professional Contractor with Contracting Plus we are here to make this process as simple and smooth as possible for you.



ON YOUR BIKE

A look at the updated rules for the Bike to Work Scheme

As a keen cyclist myself to get to and from our office in Merrion Square I am especially pleased with the Governments recent efforts at improving and extending cycle lanes. Now with increases in tax relief...

cycling is good for your pocket as well as your health.

Under the 2020 revised scheme, the limit on allowable expenditure has increased from €1,000 to €1,500 for ebikes and €1,250 for other bicycles and related safety equipment, without a benefit in kind charge. The tax exemption can now be availed of once in any four year period.

We can assist you purchase your brand new bike and equipment and process it through your payroll without you incurring a BIKE charge. This means that you are saving up to 52% of tax and on a purchase of €1,500 that's a saving of €780, best illustrated by an example:



	Without Scheme €	With Scheme €
Gross income in October 2020	4,500	4,500
Purchase ebike through payroll	-	(1,500)
Taxable salary	4,500	3,000
Tax, USC & PRSI - assume top rates apply	(2,340)	(1,560)
Net income	2,160	1,440
Purchase Ebike not through payroll	(1,500)	-
Cash left in your pocket with the same bike!	660	1,440

Whats the catch?...

There is actually no catch but just some rules to be aware of:

- ✓ As mentioned since 1 August 2020 the limit on the amount you can spend to get the relief has increased to a maximum of €1,250 (or €1,500 for electric bikes).
- ✓ You can spend less if you want but remember you will need to wait 4 years to benefit from the scheme again.
- ✓ To avail of the limits the purchase must be in the one transaction, so you can't decide to buy your helmet a few months later!
- ✓ It only covers new bikes. Second hand bikes and equipment don't qualify for the tax relief. Scooters, e-scooters and mopeds are not covered.



Bike to work scheme

What's allowed?

- Delivery charges.
- Cycle helmets which conform to European standard EN 1078.
- Bells and bulb horns.
- Lights, including dynamo packs.
- Mirrors and mudguards to ensure riders visibility is not impaired.
- Cycle clips and dress guards.
- Panniers, luggage carriers and straps to allow luggage to be safely carried.
- Locks and chains to ensure bicycle can be safely secured.
- Pumps, puncture repair kits, cycle tool kits and tyre sealant to allow for minor repairs, reflective clothing along with white front reflectors and spoke reflectors.

So if this is of interest to you then drop into your local bike shop. You'll be supporting local businesses and saving tax. Of course you can also purchase your bike and equipment from online stores. Just remember, before you sign on the dotted line contact your Dedicated Account Manager to ensure that you can benefit from this attractive scheme.

Another benefit of following relevant companies and joining relevant groups, is to ensure you never miss useful advice and tips.



Tips to improve your Personal LinkedIn profile




Put Keywords and Search Terms in Your "Skills" Section

Keywords help you get found in search results on LinkedIn. Populating your skills with keywords will make your profile show up when someone searches for that word or phrase. LinkedIn lets you put up to 50 keywords in your skills section. A little effort here can have a big impact on how many times you will appear in search results, making lining up your next role much easier.



Review profiles of thought-leaders in your industry

Look at the skills they are listing. You might find a keyword you didn't think about. Read their headline and see if you can improve yours. Look at a couple of profiles and note what is interesting about them. Try and incorporate these ideas into your own profile.



Lead with your accomplishments under past job

Lead with results and accomplishments in bullet points under each previous job. Use verbs like *increased*, *led*, *managed* and *developed* followed by specific results. Talk about what you've achieved, and how you have been successful in former roles. Include metrics where possible.



Make a good first impression

Your image and your headline (the sentence right below your name on your profile) are your LinkedIn 'first impression' so you need to make sure they work.

Make sure your image looks professional and friendly and consider adding a keyword to your headline if there is any ambiguity in what you do caused by your current job title.



Add recommendations to your profile

Get two or three recommendations from people you know or have worked with in the past.

Don't be afraid to ask people for a recommendation. Recommendations are very powerful, they build trust and credibility and will increase your chances of being considered for a suitable role.

Small Benefit Scheme

€500 TAX FREE EVERY YEAR

The ability to claim business expenses is one of the key benefits of being an Independent Contractor. Under the Small Benefit Scheme you can take a non-cash payment of up to €500 every year, Tax Free!

The Government made a small change to the Small Benefit Scheme for tax year 2020. Revenue have announced that for the tax year 2020, the single gift rule does not apply. This means that where previously the full €500 had to be made in a single purchase you can now split this over 2 vouchers, however the total voucher value has not changed and remains at €500.

For example, You can purchase one voucher for €500 in 2020

purchase one voucher now for €200 and still purchase another voucher for €300 later in the year.

Vouchers can be purchased from any supplier of your choice, but you need to ensure that the receipts are made out to your Umbrella Company or Personal Limited Company when the vouchers are purchased.

To avail of the scheme simply

- 1. Purchase your voucher (ensure the receipt made out to your company / umbrella company name).
- 2. Upload the receipt into your Contracting PLUS App/portal/accounts software.
- 3. The tax relief on the cost will be returned in your upcoming payroll.

Its important to note however that the concession of the additional voucher is only available to those who continued to work through the pandemic.

Contracting PLUS works closely with Me2You. These vouchers can be used in 1,000's of stores in Ireland. For more information on this scheme click here.

The turnaround to receive the voucher is circa 5-7 working days after your payroll is complete.

You will automatically receive tax relief on the purchase as it is exempt from Income Tax, USC (Universal Social Charge) and PRSI. This will mean the actual cost of a €500 gift card will be around €250 (depending on your effective tax rate).







